My dear brothers and sisters,

As Catholic Charities presents its strategic plan, it does so at a most critical time. With the steep increase of people (especially children) living in poverty; homelessness reaching an all-time high; the continued crisis of explicit and illegal drug use; dangerous and harmful political ideologies infiltrating all aspects of society; and the rapidly growing and ever-expanding culture of death through unlimited access to abortion and reduced restrictions for “Medical Assistance in Dying” (which we recognize as euthanasia). There certainly is no better time to pause and reflect, pray, and enact a thoughtful and faithful path forward to best serve the most vulnerable in our community throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto.

Ultimately this strategic plan is our call to action inspired by our faith in Christ. I call to mind the words of St. Pope John Paul II, “Today more than ever, the Church is aware that her social message will gain credibility more immediately from the *witness of actions*...The Church’s love for the poor, which is essential for her and a part of her constant tradition, impels her to give attention to a world in which poverty is threatening to assume massive proportions in spite of technological and economic progress.” (*Centesimus Annus*, 57. 1 May 1991.)

It is my hope that through the implementation of the strategies outlined in this plan, the Church, through the work of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Toronto and the agencies it supports, will continue to make a difference in as many lives as possible.

May God continue to bless you in abundance, may the Blessed Mary continue to intercede for you, and may St. Michael the Archangel protect you.

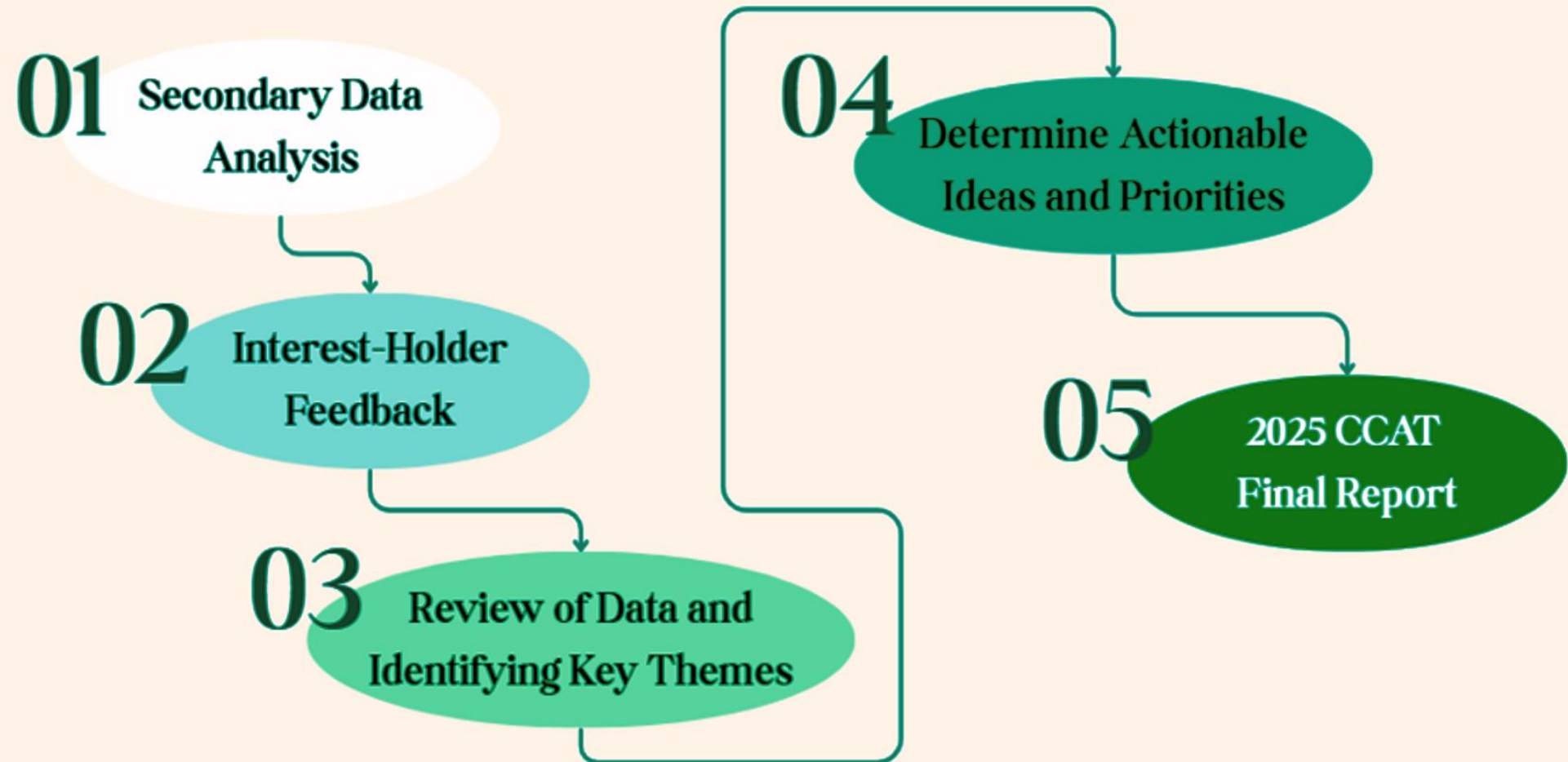

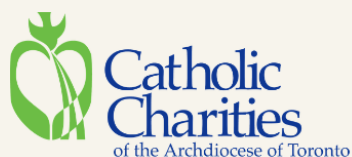
